Basic Requirements for Maintaining Annual Membership:

6 hours of participation per year. (2 must be tutoring hours.)

1 writing submission to scholarship or contest

Maintain A/B average in English.

Maintain 3.0 gpa overall

May/June (Set up for following year)

- · Log hours/obligations for graduating seniors.
- Distribute cords to seniors at donut party or ice cream party (run by juniors).
- Solicit applications for next year's leadership and select officers.
- Initial officer meeting to review responsibilities and set up target ideas for the following year.
- Distribute information about Common Reader to existing members to encourage them to read over the summer.

September (Induction)

- Open window for applications. Notify parents/students through weekly newsletters, contacting teachers to share, morning announcements.
- Meet with new officers to (a) clarify the role of each individual, (b) set up for induction, and (c) current members begin tracking participation.
 - Officers assume responsibility for posting events through Schoology, social media, and individual events.
- Applications close--determine (with faculty committee) students who will be inducted.

October (Induction)

- Send Induction letters by mail. (And decline letters)
- Meet with officers to set up script for induction and steps to induction.
- Hold induction ceremony with refreshments.
- First book club meeting.

November (Game Night)

 First event of the year is game night—students bring board games and play with other honor society members (We include Mu Alpha Theta). Good activity for welcoming the new members.

December (Writer's Week)

- Sponsored by the English Department with NEHS, fun writing and reading activities during study hall each day and after school each day. (Open to all.)
- Lancer Candy Lane. This is a Saturday event where students make Scrabble tile ornaments with children from the community. It is free to all to attend. Costs the club about \$50.
- Books for Families. We partner with our local literacy council to purchase books for two families in need. They select the families and give us a list of the children's interests—they provide \$100 for each family, and we do the shopping (at the Scholastic Book Fair) and deliver the baskets of books.
- Second book club meeting. Common Reader book talks in school and outside of school with local bookstore.

January (Banned book movie night/Fundraiser/Common Reader Book talks)

- Movie selected by the students. Includes trivia competition about the novel.
- Additional fundraising activities—this year we made greeting cards with blackout poetry and literary themes and then sold them.
- Submit national Common Reader essays.

February (Spelling Bee)

- · Held at the high school. Teams are NEHS, It's Academic, Staff
- Third book club meeting (Black History Theme)

March (Pen Pals)

- Work with local elementary school to exchange a series of four letters.
- Ends with an optional field trip.
- Announce winners of local Common Reader.

April (Poetry Month)

- Poetry on the Sidewalk or Poetry on the Windows.
- Literary door competition (teachers decorate doors with help of students to include literature or poetry.
- Videos of teacher delivering favorite poem on morning announcements.
- Poetry activities.
- Fourth Book Club Meeting (Asian American Theme.)

May (Confirmation of completion of membership requirements/honor cords)

Other Activities:
